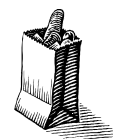

Golf Jargon made easy - As promised here is an explanation of what is meant by 'holing a putt'. To hole a putt, one simply uses the club called the 'putter' to stroke the ball into the hole. When after striking the ball, the ball goes into the hole and stays there, then you will have successfully 'holed the putt'. Now there are several variations on this theme - all of which would not hold up after reviewing the rules of golf but which are common nonetheless. The most common of these is called the 'gimme'. The gimme is offered by your competitor to you when you are close enough to the hole as to make the outcome of the next stroke a foregone conclusion. When offered a 'gimme' you are allowed to pick up your ball and score the 1 stroke as if you struck the putt and holed the ball. The 'gimme' has become such a common part of the game that many golfers no longer even wait for their competitor to offer it. There is yet another golf term used to describe this situation.
