When his younger brother Jeff arrived in High School he looked forward to the same opportunity. Jean and Jeff have been delivering Meals on Wheels together for three years.

Recently, after a fall hiatus due to many sports commitments, Jeff suggested that they start up again. Clients appreciate chatting with a young fellow about hockey statistics and other volunteers have noted this special cross-generational partnership in volunteering.

Jean comments that these Saturday mornings have been bonus all round for her. She spends quality time with grandsons for whom she cares deeply, while sharing with them a commitment to community service that began when she and her former husband delivered Meals on Wheels more than 40 years ago.

John invited Alexandra to join him many times when she was in school. But it wasn't until she was out working that she took him up on the suggestion.
